## **Governance of Pro Public**

Pro Public has a well-managed and established governance system and structure in order to run its core and project activities effectively and transparently. All our activities are guided by Financial, Administrative Guidelines and Personnel Policies endorsed by Annual General Meeting (AGM) as well as the Statue of Pro Public. Pro Public has an Executive Committee consisting of 9 Executive officials/members including a President, Vice-President, General Secretary, Treasurer, Joint Secretary and four Executive Members. The election of the Executive Committee is held in every three years. As per the Statue of Pro Public, atleast 44% of the positions of the Executive Committee (EC) are reserved for women; Dalit, Madhesi, physically challenged person, minorities and indigenous communities (Article 12). At present, there are 5 (56%) female members, out of 9, in the executive committee.

Similarly, members of the EC are not allowed to hold the same position for more than two terms (Article 12 A). A staff member is not allowed to run for any position of the EC. In the same way, a member of the EC is not allowed to work as regular staff. Pro Public has binding standards of guidelines i.e. personnel, financial, sexual harassment, procurement, communication, safeguarding, safety and security, grievance handling, and so forth. Pro Public has total of 98 members, out of which 31% are "women". It has members from marginalized communities.

# Major Milestones of Pro Public over the past three decades

### PEACE BUILDING AND CONFLICT TRANSFORMATION

Pro Public has been implementing various programs in peace building and conflict transformation using tools such as Mediation; Social Dialogue; Enacting Dialogue; Peace Research; Non-Violent Communication (NVC); and Restorative Dialogue both as preventive and curative measures aimed at resolving disputes and promoting strong relationships among the people in the communities to establish "Culture of Peace" and to build a resilient society.

## **Community Mediation**

- » Over 2500 mediators trained in about 80 Local Government Unit (LGUs) of Nepal,
- » Around 70 community mediation centers established and 10,000 local disputes settled,
- » Developed resource pool for 15 certified mediation trainers.
- » 300 mediators trained on multi-stakeholders mediation,
- » Social marketing of mediation through radio, posters, leaflets, hoarding board, wall painting, and street drama in 60 LGUs.
- » Pro Public facilitated training in about 70 LGUs for the Judicial Committee in the capacity of a training providing institution under Mediation Council Nepal,
- » Established endowment fund of around 12 million rupees for the sustainability of the mediation,
- » The contribution made to ensure this provision "Judicial Committee" in the municipalities and rural municipalities through Article-217 of the Constitution of Nepal,
- » 20 best mediators award provided,
- » 60 Advisory Committees formed and convened involving a total more than 1800 members representing from "Various walks of Life",
- » Training Manual prepared and published in cooperation with Access to Justice (A2J) program of UNDP.

## Promoting Peace through Dialogue, Libraries and Media

- » 150 Dialogue Facilitators (50% from ex-combatants) trained in Dialogue Facilitation in 16 LGUs of 12 districts,
- » 215 social dialogue groups formed involving 1720 members (50% excombatants) and convened 7 steps of dialogue fortnightly,
- » 40 Dialogue group formed involving 400 members and convened.
- » 13 peace libraries established and were visited by altogether 50 thousand community people,
- » Radio Jingles on dialogue, mediation, and psychosocial counselling aired by various local FM stations with hundred thousands of listeners.
- » 60 mass based peace events organized with participation of above 50000 people,
- » 20 community envisioning organized and provided action plans to the concerned government agencies,
- » 16 events of community dialogue on Gender Based Violence (GBV), Dowry, Child Labour, Chhaupadi organized.

## **Enacting Dialogue (Playback Theater):**

- » Developed resource pool of 10 trained Playback Theatre Master Trainers and 60 Dialogue facilitating artists (DF) and engaged in 7 districts,
- » 500 Playback Theater organized, participated by 60 audiences each (total 30,000) and more than 2000 stories Shared,
- » 2 documentaries; 3 story books; a book "Enacting Dialogue: From Concept to Practice "Reflections from Nepal"; Enacting Dialogue Operation Guidelines & Mediation Handbook published,
- » 2 Enacting Dialogue and Mediation Centers established formally in east and west cluster involving Playback Theater artists.

### **Nonviolent Communication (NVC)**

- » 700 participants (Mediators, Dialogue Facilitators, local peace committees, members of Province assembly representatives from government agencies, psychosocial counselor including NHRC, CIEDP, TRC, locally elected representatives, teachers and students trained on NVC.
- » Developed resource pool of 15 NVC facilitators,
- » Produced a documentary on NVC "In the Eyes of Good",
- » 290 elected representatives from 58 local government have been trained on NVC.

- » Published books entitled "Collections of Environmental Cases" including 44 Landmark cases filed by Pro Public,

### GOOD GOVERNANCE AND SOCIAL ACCOUNTABILITY

- » The Good Governance Program (GGP), launched in 1997, produced around 650 episodes of radio magazine, 250 episodes of fortnightly television program & bulletins. Over 6,300 Good Governance Clubs in all districts with around 62,000 members were sensitized. Organized hundreds of public hearing and campaigns throughout the country,
- » Organised a number of public hearing on the nomination of the potential candidates on the constitutional commissions and different level of the elections.
- » Implemented National Capacity Development Institute with support from World Bank's Program for Accountability in Nepal (PRAN), Three hundred CSOs, media and government representatives from 43 districts were trained, engaged in social accountability activities (SAc). 104 sub-grantees mentored and coached on SAc Tools implementation,
- » Implemented civil society support project to improve services of some key ministries particularly the MOES, MOHP, MOAC, MOLD and MOLRM from 2003 to 2005. Representative from three hundred CSOs were trained along with member of advocacy, media campaign, interaction and workshops,
- » Implemented Civil Society Anti-Corruption Project from 2005 to 2007 in 10 districts that trained more than 1000 representatives from CSOs and the government as well as launched Campaigns,
- » Worked with 60 Community Forest Users Groups and 60 Irrigation Water User Associations in 120 Village Development Committees and provided training to 265 people including government representatives under Strengthening Advocacy Capacity and Local Government Accountability from 2002 to 2004.

### **PUBLIC INTEREST LITIGATION**

Filed hundreds of public interest litigation (PIL) at different courts on issues, among others, environmental protection, gender equality, human rights, child rights, consumer rights, and good governance over the years and achieved significant milestones.

At present, Pro Public has been filing public interest litigation and pursuing cases related to civil liberty and human rights, gender and social justice and environmental rights since September 1994. Initially the program was supported by The Asia Foundation, Kathmandu, Nepal. Due to the good outcome of the project ARD/ USAID Rule of Law Project is also provided support for new cases and advocacy work of Public. Later Save The Children and OHCHR also supported for the intervention. Even when there is no support, Pro Public runs these interventions on its own.









### STRENGTHENING DEMOCRACY AND HUMAN RIGHTS



- » 200 media people were trained and engaged in radio, television and open-air Public Debates on Issues surrounding the Constituent Assembly (PDICA) in 40 districts,
- » 100 central level political party leaders and over 10 thousands community people interfaced under "Leaders, Listen to the Voice of People!" targeting the CA election from July to September 15, 2007,
- » 100 public hearing organized across the country attended by 10 thousand people and a book published defining the Public Agenda for Strengthening Constituencies for Peace and Reform in Nepal in 2006,

- » Over 1,20,000 people provided civic education in eight modules under Civic awareness program,
- » Provided civic education and voter education to 74,405 and 83,412 respectively under Coalition for Constituent Assembly Support,
- » Organized community dialogue and round table discussion between members of parliaments in 20 districts including 10 mock parliaments for young political party leaders,
- » "Coalition for Gender Responsive Electoral process in Nepal" implemented in 2013 in all 75 districts and 240 constituencies participated by 3,177 people,
- » Numbers of Advocacy, Interactions, Campaigns and Workshop going on.

### **PUBLIC HEALTH**

Trained and engaged 100 young leaders in different districts for the Advocacy in public health through Leadership Development and Mobilization of Young Leaders in Response to HIV and AIDS Proiect.







### **CONSUMER PROTECTION AND FARMER'S RIGHTS**

In order to equip the consumer organizations and media with the capacity to cope with the onslaught of liberalization and globalization and to help them better protect the interests of the consumers and also to promote the farmer's rights issues Pro Public intervened in multiple interventions.

- More than 25 seminars were organized in different places of Nepal on consumer protection that were participated by more than 1000 audience representing government institutions, civil society organizations, media houses, consumer committees, teachers, law practitioners intellectuals form various districts were participated,
- A number of South Asian Level Regional and national level Seminar on Competition Policy and Consumer Protection in the Context of Liberalization were organized and collaborated,
- Pro Public launched media advocacy by providing training to representatives of different media from different parts of the country particularly on agro-biodiversity,
- Pro Public organized series of events to build networking with the organization working in the areas of Trade-Related Aspects of Intellectual Property Rights (TRIPs), Farmers' Tights, and Food Security,
- Pro Public carried out number of research in the area of trade. i..e, Access to and Use of Biological Resources by Dabur Nepal Private Limited; Access to Genetic Resources and Benefit Sharing: Perceptions, Practices and Expectations of Farming Communities; and plant variety protection and Farmers' Rights".



## **GENDER EQUALITY AND JUSTICE**

- » Provided capacity building training to hundreds of judges from different courts; conducted researches, advocacy from 1996 to 2006,
- » Altogether 75 judgments and 90 charge sheets related to Rape and Trafficking analysed from gender equality justice perspective,
- » Organized 35 court room observations to understand gender sensitivity in the court room,
- » Drafted a shadow constitution from women's rights and gender equality perspective,
- » Trained more than 2000 mediators on Gender Equality and Social Inclusion,
- » Utilized GECI as cross-cutting session in the other interventions,
- Organized number of Campaigns, Workshops, Dialogue and advocacy,
- » Organized "Men Engage" program to end all forms of discrimination.

### SOME IMPACTS of PRO PUBLIC

Pro Public's works over the years have had some significant impact which are given below:

- » Contributed to the formulation of Good Governance Act and Right to Information Act along with their by-laws,
- » Contributed to the formulation of guidelines on Public Hearing 2062; Public Audit and Social Audit Directive 2063; Simplification of Government Decision Directives, 2065.
- » Contributed to the formulation of Mediation Act 2068 and its by-law and establishment of the Mediation Council under it to institutionalize mediation in Nepal,
- » Contributed to the provision of Article 217 of the Constitution of Nepal that deals with the formation and operation of judicial committees at the local level. These committees are part of the decentralized governance system in Nepal with the legal framework of the Local Operation Act 2074 (2017),
- » Contributed to the establishment of National Judicial Academy in 2004,
- » Contributed to the establishment of National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) in Nepal.
- » Contributed to the campaign that led to the banning of commercial ads of alcohol and tobacco in TV and radio Nepal,
- » Contributed to the formulation of Government policy on single women allowance,
- » Contributed to safeguarding 'Guthi' land from abuse and encroachment,
- » Contributed to the issuance of guidelines from Supreme Court on ending all forms of abuse and exploitation of women workers, and making it decent and women workers-friendly..














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
